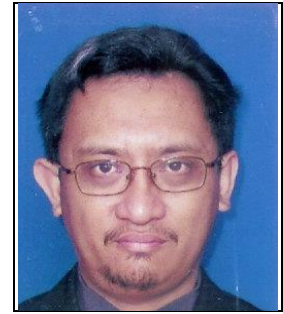

Currently, he is in the Department of Quantity Surveying, Kulliyyah of Architecture and Environmental Design (KAED). Since 2013, he has been seconded to the International Institute for Halal Research and Training (INHART), IIUM, and served as the Head of Consultancy.
