

**INTERNATIONAL ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY MALAYSIA
TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 2015**

PART I - PRELIMINARY

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the International Islamic University Malaysia Road Traffic Regulations 2015.

Application

2. (1) These Regulations shall apply to all students, staff, contractor, visitor and other road users while in the University Campus.

(2) The student, staff member, contractor, visitor and other road users shall acquaint themselves with and comply with the provisions under these Regulations.

(3) These Regulations shall be read together with-

- (a) Road Traffic Act 1987;
- (b) Staff Disciplinary Rules 2012; and
- (c) Students Disciplinary Rules 2004 (Amendment 2006)

and shall include any amendments therein.

Interpretation

3. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires-

“Campus” means Campus or Branch Campus of the International Islamic University Malaysia which includes Kulliyyah, Mahallah and other premises of the University;

“clamp” means an act of immobilizing a motor vehicle using an appropriate equipment;

“Compoundable Offence” means any breach punishable with a penalty of fine which may be imposed for breach of the offence under these Regulations;

“Constitution” means collectively the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the University;

“Contractor” includes any person employed either directly or indirectly for contract for services with the University;

“Driver” means any person driving or in control of a motor vehicle;

“Traffic offence” includes any breach stated in the Road Traffic Regulations;

“Majlis” means the University’s Authority established under Article 17 of the Constitution;

“Officer” includes any person with an executive functions attached to any office, department or division whether directly or indirectly under the Traffic Authority;

“other users” means any individual other than staff, student, contractor and visitor;

“motor vehicle” means every description of vehicle propelled by means of mechanism contained within itself and constructed or adapted so as a capable of being used on roads, and includes any vehicle drawn by a motor vehicle whether or not part of the vehicles so drawn is superimposed on the drawing *motor vehicle*.

“University Campus” means the Campus established by the University inclusive of existing its land, buildings, *kulliyah* and *mahallah*.

“person” includes staff, students, contractors, visitors and other persons in the University;

“Rector” means a person as defined in the Constitution;

“Security Officer” includes any category of security personnel or auxiliary police appointed by the University and entrusted with the duty of enforcement of any rules, regulations, orders and directives in the University;

“student” includes any undergraduate student, postgraduate student, part-time student, student under distance learning or off-campus programme, diploma student, matriculation student, exchange and non-graduating student of the University;

“staff” means any person employed under a contract of service with the University;

“University” means International Islamic University Malaysia; and

“visitor” means any person or group of people that enters the University Campus other than staff, students and contractors.

PART II – POWERS OF THE TRAFFIC AUTHORITY

Traffic Authority

4. (1) The Traffic Authority of the University in respect of the students, staff, visitors, contractor and other road users of the University campus shall be the head in charge of the security management of the University who shall manage the road traffic system and to impose any measure for the administration and enforcement of these Regulations.

(2) The Traffic Authority may delegate his powers mentioned under sub-regulations (1) to other security officers or committee of the University.

Powers of the Traffic Authority

5. In performing his duties, the Traffic Authority shall have the following powers which includes-

- a) to restrain or stop any motor vehicle which do not displays the valid sticker from entering or remaining in the University Campus;
- b) to stop any motor vehicle or any person that breached these Regulations in the University Campus and to take any particulars of the driver or user for further action;
- c) to direct any motor vehicle to leave the University Campus;
- d) to issue compound to any student, staff members, contractor, visitor and other road users that committed traffic offences under these Regulations;

- e) to clamp or immobilise any vehicle that contravened any provision under these Regulations;
- f) to revoke any permission for bringing in, keeping or possessing motor vehicle in the University Campus; and
- g) to take any other action deemed necessary and expedient for the administration and enforcement of these Regulations.

PART III – ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT

Permission to keep, bring, possess etc. motor vehicle in Campus

6. (1) A student, staff, contractor, and other road users who wishes to keep, bring, possess any motor vehicle on University Campus shall apply for and obtain a written permission from the Traffic Authority.

(2) Application shall be in writing specifying the description of the motor vehicle in a specified form and shall be accompanied with the current and valid motor vehicle license and other relevant documents as prescribed by the Traffic Authority.

(3) The written permission of the Traffic Authority may in the form of a vehicle sticker or in any other form as determined by the Traffic Authority.

(4) The valid vehicle sticker must be affixed to the windscreen of the vehicle or, in the case of a motorcycle, in a conspicuous place on the motorcycle.

(5) It shall be an offence for a student, staff, contractor, and other road users member to bring a vehicle into the Campus without a permission from the by the Traffic Authority and the student or staff as the case may be shall subject to a compound mentioned under Regulation15 herein.

Refusal to give permission

7. (1) The Traffic Authority may refuse to grant permission under Regulation 6, withhold or revoke any permission given if it is satisfied that it would not be in the interest of the University for the student, staff, contractor, and other road users to hold such permission.

(2) The Traffic Authority may also refuse to grant permission, withhold or revoke permission given if the student or staff member has outstanding fine to any offence under these Regulations.

PART IV- PARKING AND TRAFFIC OFFENCES

Parking

8. (1) No one shall park a motor vehicle on University Campus unless:-
- (a) the motor vehicle bears a valid sticker; and
 - (b) the vehicle is parked in accordance with signage in an area on University Campus which permits parking.
- (2) No one shall park any vehicle at any place or in any manner so as to cause danger, obstruction or inconvenience to any other person or vehicle.
- (3) No one shall park a motor vehicle in a position or manner which impedes use of handrails or facilities designated to assist people with disability.
- (4) No one shall park any vehicle on any corridor, verandah foot way, courtyard or in any part of any building.
- (5) Where a parking bay is allotted for a particular motor vehicle, no one shall park a different motor vehicle in such parking bay.
- (6) Where a motor vehicle is parked or driven by a person other than the registered owner of the said motor vehicle in contravention of these Regulations, the registered owner of the vehicle shall be held responsible for the contravention, notwithstanding that another person was responsible.
- (7) Any one that contravened this Regulation shall be subjected to a compound mentioned under Regulation 15.

Production of driving license

9. (1) A person who is driving or riding a motor vehicle or in charge or in control of the said motor vehicle shall carry with him a valid driving license issued to him under the Road Transport Act, 1987 valid and recognized international driving license by Road Transport Department together his student or staff card as the case may be and shall produce the same for inspection by any security officer whenever required to do so.

Traffic direction

10. (1) A person shall comply with all traffic directions and with all traffic signs provided in the University campus.

(2) Any person that contravened this Regulation shall be subjected to a compound mentioned under Regulation 15.

Speed limit

11. (1) No one shall drive or ride a motor vehicle in the University campus at a speed in excess of that indicated by a traffic sign.

(2) Any person that contravened this Regulation shall be liable for a compound mentioned under Regulation 15.

Pillion riding

12. (1) A person riding a motorcycle shall not carry more than one person on such motorcycle.

(2) No one shall carry a pillion rider on a two-wheeled motorcycle unless such pillion rider is sitting astride the motorcycle behind the rider on a properly designed seat securely fixed to the motorcycle.

(3) A person shall not allow himself to ride pillion on a motorcycle ridden by any person in contravention of subregulation (1) and (2) of this regulation.

(4) Any person that contravene this Regulation shall be liable for a compound mentioned under Regulation 15.

Production of driving license

13. (1) A person riding a motorcycle or a pillion passenger shall wear approved motorcycle helmet at all times while riding.

(2) Any person that contravenes this Regulation shall be liable for a compound mentioned under Regulation 15.

Reckless and dangerous driving

14. Any person who drives motor vehicle on a road recklessly in the University Campus which is dangerous to the other road users or public shall be guilty for an offence and shall be liable for a compound mentioned under Regulation 15.

PART V – SANCTIONS

Compound

15. (1) Any person who contravene any provision of these Regulations shall subject to a compound for a sum of Ringgit Malaysia Hundred (RM100.00) for each offence under these Regulations.

(2) A compound issued under these Regulations shall be paid within fourteen (14) days from the date of its issuance.

(3) A compound issued under these Regulations shall be dealt with in accordance with the compound procedures made by the University.

(4) Any reduction of a compound issued under this Regulation shall be decided by the Security officer determined by the Rector.

Clamping

16. (1) Notwithstanding the compound issued under Regulation 15, the Traffic Authority may clamp a motor vehicle that breached the regulation relating to parking.

(2) A fine for a sum of Ringgit Malaysia Hundred (RM100.00) shall be imposed prior to the release of such clamp by the Traffic Authority.

(3) A clamp imposed under this Regulation shall be dealt with in accordance with clamping procedures made by the University.

Repeated traffic offence

17. (1) If a student or staff member repeats the same traffic offence for three (3) times, the Traffic Authority may refer the said student or staff member for a disciplinary action under the relevant student or staff disciplinary rules.

(2) A compound under these Regulations shall be no longer applicable if the student or staff member referred for disciplinary action mentioned under sub regulation (1).

Revocation of permission

18. If the Traffic Authority is of the opinion that any student or staff had abused the permission given by the Traffic Authority to keep, bring or possess his motor vehicle under these Regulations, the Traffic Authority may revoke the permission given therein.

Towing

19. (1) The Traffic Authority reserves the right to tow any motor vehicle that stopped or parked at the prohibited area in University Campus.

(2) Any motor vehicle that has been towed shall be placed at the prescribed place as determined by the Traffic Authority.

(3) Any cost for towing and storing of the motor vehicle mentioned under this Regulation shall be borne by the registered owner of the said motor vehicle.

(4) The University shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to the motor vehicle that has been towed under this Regulation.

Abandoned motor vehicle

20. (1) The Traffic Authority may move, or cause to be moved an abandoned motor vehicle within the University Campus to a prescribed place as determined by the Traffic Authority.

(2) For the purpose of this Regulation, abandoned motor vehicle means a motor vehicle that parked at the University Campus for more than fourteen (14) days continuously without moving.

(3) If the abandoned motor vehicle remain at the said prescribed place for another fourteen (14) days, the Traffic Authority reserve the right to dispose the said motor vehicle in accordance with the procedure for disposal established by the University.

(4) The appropriate notices shall be issued to the registered owner prior to any removing or disposal mentioned under sub regulation (2) and (3).

(5) Any cost relating to moving, towing or disposing of the abandoned motor vehicle shall be borne by the registered owner of the motor vehicle.

(6) The University shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to the motor vehicle that being towed under this Regulation.

PART IV - APPEAL

Appeal

21. Any appeal against any action made under these Regulations shall be made to the Rector through office in charge of the security management of the University.

PART V – GENERAL

Service of notice, compound, letter, memo *etc.*

22. Any notice, compound, letter, memo etc required to be served, delivered or given under these Regulations shall be deemed to have been sufficiently served, given or delivered if delivered or sent by a registered post to the last known address registered with the University and shall be deemed to have been duly received by the other party at the time of delivery or issuance of such notice, compound, letter, memo *etc.* when it placed at the said motor vehicle of the owner.

Amendments

23. The Majlis may make any amendment, repeal or revoke any provisions of these Regulations from time to time.

Repeal and saving

24. (1) The International Islamic University Malaysia Road Traffic Rules 2005 and Part IV of the Students' Discipline Rules 2004 (Amendment 2006) on Road Traffic Discipline are hereby repealed.

(2) Provided that any pending action under the Road Traffic Rules 2005 and Students' Discipline Rules 2004 (amendment 2006) shall be dealt in accordance with the Rules until its completion.
