



**IIUM OFFICIAL GUIDELINES
DURING THE CONDITIONAL MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER 03/2020**

** This guideline is applicable to Gombak and Kuala Lumpur campuses for the period of Conditional Movement Control Order 14th – 27th October 2020.*

SECTION 1: INTRODUCTION

1. On 12th October 2020, the Malaysian Government announced the implementation of Conditional Movement Control Order (CMCO) in Selangor, Kuala Lumpur and Putrajaya from 14th to 27th October 2020.
2. IIUM is steadfast in ensuring the safety of the staff and students. Hence, the University takes the CMCO instructions by the Government very seriously.
3. All classes will be conducted through remote teaching and learning (RTL) during CMCO period.
4. For IIUM students who are currently on campus, they may choose to:
 - a. stay on campus; or
 - b. return home before 12am on the 14th October 2020.
5. IIUM will not be held responsible for any consequences or expenses incurred by students due to the movement control order.
6. Guidelines for staff working arrangement will be issued by the Management Services Division (MSD) in due course.

SECTION 2: ON CAMPUS STUDENTS

1. Students who are on campus may choose to return home before CMCO period begins at 12am on 14th October 2020.
2. Students who returned home before CMCO begins may not re-enter the campuses until CMCO period is over.

3. Students who are on campus after CMCO begins, will not be allowed to return home until CMCO period is over, except due to emergency reasons.
4. Parents who wish to fetch their children from campus may do so before CMCO begins. Once they have fetched their children, parents are advised to leave the campus immediately.
5. Body temperature screenings will be performed at the campus entrances. Parents with body temperature of 37.5°C and above, and/or with COVID-19 symptoms will not be allowed to enter the campuses.
6. Parents must also observe the standard operating procedure (SOP) set by the University.
7. On campus students will not be allowed to leave the campuses once CMCO begins unless deemed necessary. Students must obtain permission from the *Mahallah Principals* before going out for necessary/essential services.

SECTION 3: OFF CAMPUS STUDENTS

1. Students who are presently off campus may choose to return to the Gombak and Kuala Lumpur campuses before CMCO begins, provided they are not PUIs or from high-risk and red zone areas (refer Section 5).
2. Once CMCO begins, off campus students will not be allowed to return to Gombak and Kuala Lumpur campus until CMCO is over.

SECTION 4: ON CAMPUS SERVICES

1. All classes will be conducted through RTL during CMCO. Students are required to contact their lecturers for class arrangements. All academic information can be referred on iMaalum.
2. Café operation at *Mahallah* will be extended until 12am and kiosk until 10.30pm.
3. Food delivery and postal delivery services will be allowed to enter the campuses during CMCO, subject to the SOP set by the University.
4. E-hailing and public buses will not be allowed to enter the campuses during CMCO.
5. General computer labs at ITD will be operating as usual.
6. The main library will be opened for borrowing and returning of books only.

7. Banks and shops will remain open as usual.

SECTION 5: HIGH-RISK STUDENTS

1. Students are required to follow Crisis Preparedness and Response Centre (CPRC) Telegram or website <https://t.me/cprckkm> for updates on the latest COVID-19 Green, Yellow and Red Zones.
2. Students from High-Risk or Red Zone areas are required to be aware of official announcements from IIUM regarding the date which they will be allowed to be back on campus.
3. Symptomatic students are NOT ALLOWED to return to campus, even if they are not from High-Risk or Red Zone areas. They are advised to get treatment at the nearest health facilities near their homes. They have to show evidence of such treatment when they return to campus.

SECTION 6: CONDUCT OF STUDENTS AND STAFF ON CAMPUS

1. All staff and students must:
 - a. Practice physical distancing of 1 metre apart at all times;
 - b. Avoid the 3C (**C**rowded, **C**onfined and **C**losed conversation);
 - c. Practice the 3W (**W**ash hands, **W**ear mask & **W**arn);
 - d. Observe appropriate coughing and sneezing etiquette.
2. All staff and students experiencing COVID-19 symptoms must immediately report themselves to the IIUM Health and Wellness Clinic (IHWC) or other IIUM health facilities.

SECTION 7: CONCLUSION

1. IIUM urges all staff and students to put their safety and the safety of their families and fellow colleagues as the main priority at all times. This is necessary in order to minimise the risk of COVID-19 infection among staff and students, and their family members, as well as to ensure safe operation of the University.
2. Staff and students must practice **C**leanliness, ensure **O**bedience to all instructions, always be **V**igilance of their whereabouts, *Istiqamah*/Integrity in translating instructions into practice, and **D**iscipline themselves at all times.
